



From the Pastor

The Old Testament reveals Canaanites, Moabites, and Ammonites sometimes offered children as burnt offerings to deities such as Molech or Baal, believing it would secure divine favor, fertility, or prosperity.

The prophet Jeremiah condemns the Israelites for burning their children in the Valley of Hinnom (Topheth) as offerings to Baal or Molech (above illustration from 1897 "An Offering to Molech.")

2 Chronicles 28:1-4 describe King Ahaz burning his son as an offering, imitating Canaanite practices. Similarly, 2 Kings 21:6 notes King Manasseh sacrificing his son, leading to divine judgment.

Why child sacrifice in the ancient near eastern world?

Killing something valuable demonstrated devotion to gods; in turn, you receive divine blessings and protection. What is more pure and precious than a child?

The giving of purity (child) to gods as "downpayment" on blessings was also found in Mesopotamia, Mediterranean, European, MesoAmerican (Aztecs, Myas, Incas), and Africa. The Hebrew Bible says:

'Say to the people of Israel, Any one of the people of Israel or of the strangers who sojourn in Israel who gives any of his children to Molech shall surely be put to death... I myself will set my face against that man and will cut him off from among his people, because he has given one of his children to Molech, to make my sanctuary unclean and to profane my holy name."

~Leviticus 20:2-5

The place of abomination is called "High Places":

"And they have built the high places of Topheth, which is in the Valley of the Son of Hinnom, to burn their sons and their daughters in the fire, which I did not command, nor did it come into my mind."

~Jeremiah 7:31

I spy a High Place:

Court documents show 150 people connected to Epstein—accusers, witnesses and associates.

Child Trafficking involves certain skill sets: Recruitment, transportation, and the transfer of children. Exploitation of children through force or coercion, manipulation—"fly to my resort—you will receive payment for "massaging" guests."

And the final step...Recruit, receive payment, or blackmail persons engaged in sexual acts with the "inventory" recruited. In the case of Epstein, not at a seedy hotel, but a five-star residence on a private island.

Epstein killed himself (allegedly). And ONE PERSON is jailed; Giselle Maxwell, charged with grooming and recruiting girls as young as 14.

Child sacrifice is under this umbrella.

It's easy to sit in the comfort of my office and point fingers at others—it really is the laziest form of rhetoric.

But I will discipline myself to write letters and bug a few people in power. I mostly lean into shrugging and muttering of profanity when it comes to these matters—what difference does it make? I have no political contacts or leverage of power.

And my response is a terrible lens from which to view this matter.

I suspect it starts with reflection, listening, educating, and following prompting of the Holy Spirit...and then...ACTING.

The Prophet Isaiah wrote:

"Therefore, the anger of the Lord was kindled against his people, and he stretched out his hand against them and struck them, and the mountains quaked; and their corpses were as refuse in the midst of the streets. For all this his anger has not turned away, and his hand is stretched out still."

Mission Focus: Updates from the Mission Field - July 2025



Dr. Daniel Chetti and Sarah Chetti: News from the Middle East has us on the edge of our seat as generations of warring countries and religious sects continue in front of our eyes. The images are heart wrenching. Yet quietly and steadily God's word is being shared, and hearts and minds are turning to a loving Savior. One of their recent newsletters discusses a new church plant in Iraq:

"Thanks to your faithful prayers and support, a new church has been successfully planted in Duhok, located in the Kurdistan region of northern Iraq. This growing ministry is being led by a pastor from Baghdad, who now also pastors the Duhok community alongside his wife, who plays a vital role in ministering to the youth and helping nurture the next generation of believers.

Despite the ongoing challenges facing the church in Baghdad, including financial strains tied to ministry needs and legal pressures surrounding the evangelical presence, God remains at work.

Another story from the region comes from THIMAR-LESED, a regional partner. While stories of war rage on, here is a story of hope:

"Among some individuals, there is a different story. At a THIMAR-partner church this past Sunday, several believers stood on stage and shared their testimonies. Each had been a combatant from opposing sides during the Lebanese civil war. Now they stood together under one roof, embracing each other as brothers and sisters in Christ. Their lives are testimonies to the radical healing and transformative power of the gospel. They were not just former enemies who had made peace with their pasts; they were people who had become part of one family. Such testimonies remind us of the peacemaking role that believers and the church have, especially in a country and a region long tarnished by violence and division."

Please pray for God's grace and spirit for our Christian brothers and sisters in the middle east.

I was blessed to have a few minutes with the Chetti's a few weeks ago. Their grace and joy shine through as they speak of the work going on in Lebanon as well as neighboring countries. Both said they are eager to see us again here in St. Louis while they are in the states for a few more months.
