From the Pastor

On Tuesday, March 14th, I was writing the final outline for the March 19 sermon. The text is from the single greatest chapter, located in the most important theological declaration in Christian history: Paul's Letter to the Romans, Chapter 8.


Paul "considers the sufferings of this present time are not worth comparing with the **glory** about to be revealed to us" (Romans 8:18).

Glory is the promise of sharing in Christ's heavenly glory—a resurrected body— belonging to those who share eternal life in heaven.

How are followers of Jesus assured of future glory?

Life is given through the Spirit:

But you are not in the flesh; you are in the Spirit, since the Spirit of God dwells in you...Christ is in you, though the body is dead because of sin, the Spirit is life because of righteousness....



If the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, he who raised Christ from the dead will give life to your mortal bodies also through his Spirit that dwells in you.

(Romans 8:9-11)

Paul's words of hope touched memories of teenage years in a small Baptist church, singing Blessed Assurance/Jesus is Mine/O What a Foretaste of Glory Divine.

Paul also teaches that the Spirit "helps us in our weakness." I must confess, during cold Midwest graveside services at Jefferson Barracks, looking upon a sea of crosses, doubt can creep in. Is literal, bodily resurrection possible... or is it false hope to deal with our mortality—"ultimate nothingness."

NFFNSNC was an abbreviation placed on ancient Roman tombstones—non fui; fui; non sum; non curo— "I was not; I was; I am not; I care not."

I was walking out of my office after staring at a blank computer screen. I knew the April newsletter article was due soon to Deanna, but I wasn't feeling any inspiration. I passed a bookcase on my right, and happened to notice the title, *Romans: A Verse by Verse Study,* by Herschel Hobbs—gifted to me over 40 years ago.

I opened the book—around 20 half notebook size papers fell to the ground. How about that...? Grandpa's notes on Romans, and of particular notice was his outline of Romans 8 (pictured on page 1).

Well, I had my inspiration for Third Base and began to write this pastor's article.

The scraps of paper placed me on a road of hope.

The promises Grandpa read and outlined in Romans 8 apply to all our stories. He's been gone since January of 1982 but I choose to stubbornly believe I will see him again—along with a great cloud of witnesses who have passed on.

The promise of resurrection is not up to my feelings, doubts, or worries. The same Spirit which raised Jesus from the dead will raise Grandpa, me, you, and your loved ones.

And living with this hope seems a more reasonable option than *NFFNSNC*.

In times of doubt and despair, I recall Peter's conversation with Jesus:

Jesus lost many of his disciples. Jesus turned to Peter. "Do you also wish to go away?" Peter said,

Lord, to whom can we go?
You have the words of eternal life.

He is the Way, the Truth, and the Life. And to whom else would we turn?

Beloved, He is Risen!

Musical Moment

GOOD FRIDAY

In recent years the 7 p.m. evening service at TBC has taken the form of a meditation in which music and readings describe and complement the story of Jesus's crucifixion. This is a rare opportunity for worshippers "to be still and know that I am God," and it is a time treasured by those who attend and contemplate Christ's sacrifice for us.

This year, our favorite string quartet, the Perseids, will be joined by a double bass, percussion, and guitar, to present a work in four movements that laments the death of the poet, Federico Lorca. An early victim of the Spanish Civil War, he was one of the most gifted writers since Cervantes in the 16th century. His verses, together with appropriate sacred readings, will punctuate the music by Patrick Gowers, a prominent British composer and long-time music director for Royal Shakespeare Company.

Third is indebted to his widow, Caroline, for providing the score that will enable us to present the North American premiere of the piece; the music is sure to enhance and sharpen our wonder at the loss of innocence, and at Christ's suffering on the Cross.
