



From the Pastor

The confrontation with an ancient Mesopotamian demon (Pazuzu) called for Merrin to proclaim with authority: "I cast you out unclean spirit, in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit!"—exorcising demon from a 12-year-old girl.

Max Von Sydow, the great Swedish actor, was unconvincing in his delivery. After several takes William Friedkin was at his wits end—and approached Sydow in his trailer—"Max, what is it?" Sydow admitted, "William, I just don't believe in God." Friedkin was stunned, "Max, you played Jesus Christ in The Greatest Story Ever Told."

He replied, "Yes, but I played Jesus as a man, not the Son of God".

Max von Sydow was comfortable playing a man but invoking the Trinity—Father, Son. and Holy Spirit with passion was a difficult challenge as an atheist.

Friedkin suggested playing Merrin as just a man, attempting to help a very sick girl—30 minutes later he walked out of trailer and delivered an iconic performance, "The power of Christ compels you!"

The Bible contains several verses proclaiming Jesus is God and Jesus proclaiming unity with God the Father.

Do you remember townspeople's response to Jesus after casting out multiple demons of man possessed by Legion?

They were amazed—the man was now clothed and calm. He once ran among the tombs, gnashing his flesh with cut stones and howling night and day. Any attempt to restrain with chains and shackles was futile. But they did have one request:

Jesus, leave...

Jesus as another prophet and moral teacher assassinated by the State is the "agreeable Jesus."

His sayings receive similar weight as Gandhi, Buddha, and other teachers offering "enlightenment" or "direction to healthy living."

But once you cross the rubicon—Jesus is LORD—Jesus is Sovereign—Jesus took on the sins of the world and died on the cross for you—and proved claim of Divinity by rising from the dead—this is a bridge too far for many.

Rembrandt's painting, The Raising of Lazarus (page 1) challenges your world view—only God can raise someone from the dead—Jesus said, "I and the Father are One" and "Before Abraham was...I am..."

The familiar summation by C.S. Lewis: Jesus is either lunatic, liar, or LORD rings true.

Jesus prayed:

I praise you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, because you have hidden these things from the wise and learned and revealed them to little children. Yes, Father, for this was your good pleasure."

Beloved, open yourself up to the revelation of Jesus Christ—and by faith embrace Jesus' authority over death—"and if the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead is living in you, he who raised Christ from the dead will also give life to your mortal bodies because of his Spirit who lives in you." (Romans 8:11)

He is Risen. Jesus is LORD Grace and Peace, Tommy

How Does Giving to Missions Work at Third Baptist Church?

Giving to missions at TBC may seem complex, but here's a straightforward breakdown of how it works:

1. Unified Budget Funds

Each November, members pledge money to support the church for the following year. Ten percent (10%) of all pledged funds are designated for **missions**, and the Missions Team allocates these funds as follows:

- 51% Direct missionary support, helping sustain long-term partnerships with specific missionaries.
- **33**% Support for broader mission efforts through American Baptist Churches International Ministries (ABCIM) and Cooperative Baptist Fellowship (CBF) at the state and national levels.
- **16**% Undesignated funds, distributed at the end of the year as Christmas gifts to our missionaries to provide additional support during the holiday season.

Note: The total available for missions depends on the final pledged contributions, which may fluctuate each year.

2. World Mission Offering

This fund is **separate from the Unified Budget** and does not expire at year-end. Instead, it accumulates over time and is used for mission projects at the discretion of the Missions Team. Unlike budgeted mission funds, donations to this offering provide flexibility to respond to urgent needs throughout the year. Recent contributions supported:

- Christian Activity Center: Adopt a Child Christmas Project
- Kihomi & Nzunga (ABCIM) and the Cap Haitian Eye Clinic
- Hurricane Helene relief through CBF and Samaritan's Purse
- Scarlette Jasper's ministry (CBF) serving low-income communities in Kentucky
- The Chettis' ministry (ABCIM), assisting displaced persons in Lebanon & Syria
- Ukrainian displaced persons (ABCIM)
- TBC Food Bank for Christmas Baskets, ensuring local families in need receive food assistance
