#### Welcome to Third's Pulpit Sunday, November 16 Dan and Sarah Chetti



#### Families, wanting to volunteer?



## Mission Focus November: 175 Years of Missions at Third

Studying our mission history at Third Baptist has been a very interesting journey. And *our* story began with missionaries. The Triennial Baptist Convention in Philadelphia in 1817, blessed John Peck and James Ely Welch to travel to the Louisiana Purchase to "labor among the heathen." And so, the story begins. Together they helped organize First Baptist, who begat Second Baptist. Second Baptist begat Third Baptist Church by sending thirty missionaries from their own congregation to establish the new church.

Many stories of missionaries are told in Dorothy Wofford's book, "Thou Hast Given a Banner." Three stories tie so beautifully to our mission story today.

In 1893 a young man travels to the US from his home in Lebanon. Said Jreidini (Sigh-yEEd Juryidini) heads to Chicago to the World's Fair. There he hears evangelists D. L. Moody and Thomas Spurgeon. Being a sceptic, he rejects the message but continues going back to hear them. Soon he visits St. Louis and stays with a member of Third. Hearing the word of God by Pastor William Smith of Third Baptist Church, he accepts Christ as his Savior and is baptized.

When he heads home to Lebanon, he cannot stop declaring the word of God. Later Pastor Smith travels to the Middle East, and finally Beirut and with his companions examines Jreidini to ordain him as a Baptist Pastor. From this small beginning is launched the story of Baptists in the Middle East. Our ties to Lebanon are still strong as we support the mission work of Dan and Sarah Chetti.

In 1959, Gloria Pierce, a member of Third marries Dr. John Marshall. Together they travel to the Belgian Congo right in the middle of the uprising to throw off Belgian rule. They survived the uprising and spent the next 12 years serving the Lord by building medical facilities and schools of agriculture and theology, in Kinshasa. Today we help support Dr. Tim and Kathy Rice who serve in Congo.

Finally, in 1962, a young graduate nurse, volunteers for missions and is appointed to Nigeria in West Africa. She sails from New York to Lagos, Nigeria, then 12 miles in a canoe on the Orashi River to reach Joinkrama, Nigeria. There she ministers to hearts and souls healing body and spirit. Finally, she goes to Eku, a large mission compound, where she taught nursing for the next two years. When Delilah Jones returned to the US, she joined Third Baptist and met Robert Canning who she marries. Today this beautiful story is completed by her deep friendship with a young Nigerian man in our congregation, Chidi Okafar.

Wofford lists 90 members of Third who became missionaries, ministers or went into other Christian education work. Mission seeds planted grow in faraway places as the word of God moves across the world.
