From the Pastor

Reels on Facebook are video posts up to 90 seconds in length.

I noticed an uptick on short scenes from 1970's and 80's—scrolling across visuals—"a world with no cell phones, personal computers, or social media."

I'm not a fan of nostalgia and "good old days." Billy Joel wrote, "the good old days weren't always good and tomorrow's not as bad as it seems." The old believe their time was good—because they were young.

My time period of youthful nostalgia is mid-70s to mid-80's. Memories of youth are *imprinted* into our brain. I can listen to any song from this time period, and I'm taken back to a world which no longer exists.

A Facebook post asked, "what is one short lyric, which takes you back to your youth?" I wrote without hesitation, Boston's More Than a Feeling. As the song crescendos, "it's more than a feeling, when I hear that old song they used to play, I begin dreaming..." I'm not the only one: checking Spotify, More Than a Feeling passed one billion listens.

But I've arrived at sad conclusion—those days may have been better days.

Imagine growing up as a teenager in today's culture... What would happen to your quality of life with full access to social media and cell phones. Your first impulses are sent, read, recorded, and never deleted.

How do you process living in this atmosphere with brain not fully formed? And it gets worse...

The adults, on both sides of the aisle, are passing unsustainable debt to our children—exceeding 37 trillion dollars.

But adults do vote as one concerning legalization of marijuana. The American main street is fast food, Walmart, and cannibas shops. What long term effects will be discovered in the late 2020's into 2030?

Adult leaders refuse to place restrictions on teenagers' easy access to pornography, whose only limit is their imagination.

This generation of youth are bombarded with sexual confusion—engaged in serious discussion on what is a man and what is a woman? The transitioning of female to male, and male to female?

"Food pantries in St. Louis face longer lines and rising prices" - was the headline in the Post-Dispatch on a recent Sunday.





Children and Youth are invited to sit with Drew near the front right of the sanctuary where there is space and materials to draw, create, read, pray, and play (quietly!)








And finally: Join us for youth led worship, September 14, 2025! You'll want to worship with us as our Youth prepare and lead our service this special day.
