



From the Pastor

The boy grew up with a single mom, renting in a rich part of town—for the privilege of attending school in a quality district.

The pressures of money were ever present and the affordability of attending a good college was out of the question.

The boy's anxiety and restlessness were ever present, for the inability to control his environment or destiny.

However...the boy's left arm! He loved playing baseball. But now, in his adolescence, this boy's game could no longer receive treatment as a game. The boy's left arm was his solution.

In games when he was scheduled to pitch, the boy was intense and turned inward, all focus on the challenge at hand – "I cannot give energies to school work today." His coach remembers him sitting on the bench—with an intense, blank stare before taking the mound. The boy was only 14 years old.

One month before turning 15 he met Ellen. She was outgoing and friendly and a member of the school's drill team. The boy asked her out, and they began to date.

Ellen's parents became a surrogate family to the boy, and he experienced the warmth of a stable, loving family. The boy and his mom would connect with Ellen's family during holidays. The boy would join Ellen's family each Sunday for worship services.

This opened a door for conversations about faith between the boy and Ellen. The boy changed his view of God— from one of distance to one as close as the boy's heart—and God's grace was all around him.

The left arm of the boy received a reframing:

The Gift of his left arm was not a burden but an instrument, and honoring this gift required doing his best. Colossians 3:23 was adopted as his life verse:

Whatever you do, work at it with your whole heart, as working for the Lord...

The young teenage boy evolved from good to a *great* pitcher. The discipline, exercised through the framework of honoring God's gift with hard work, was incorporated from young adult to adult stages of his life.

He would marry Ellen and have four children.

Choosing to live in the same city, the boy's mom rented in the rich part of town— Highland Park, Texas.

ESPN rated the greatest left hander pitchers of all time. The boy ranked third—behind Randy Johnson and his mentor while playing for the Dodgers, Sandy Koufax. The boy's name is Clayton Kershaw.

Clayton Kershaw was drafted by the Dodgers in 2006—and has become one in a long line of beloved Dodger pitchers. Clayton is in the winter of his career, returning in a few weeks to pitch for the Dodgers after one year of rehabilitation.

Clayton has earned around \$300 million playing a boy's game—but money is not the point. It was the drive to be the best—a good steward of God's gift of a left arm. Given an ability to contort his arm and shoulders, throwing a baseball in a way not intended for the body.

Andy McCollough ends his biography of Kershaw on this note:

I drove by his home in Highland Park, Christmas Eve of 2022, before Clayton wrecked his arm and considered retirement. As I rolled past his lawn, I saw a pair of two pint sized kids bouncing on a trampoline. Outside the protective netting, illuminated by Christmas lights stood their dad.

Someday Clayton Kershaw's career will end. His life will not. He will continue on, as a husband, as a father, as a man. He will have to work at it with all his heart.

Paul says:

Whatever you do, work at it with your whole heart...as unto the Lord.

Ellen Sechrest – Ellen serves CBF as the Director for Mission Engagement. She was instrumental in introducing us to Jana. Ellen will also be in St. Louis in June and plans to visit Third on June 22nd as well. Third Baptist meets the criteria of an "Encourager Church". Ellen will unpack what that means and work with us to commit to fully engage with Jana in her work.

Scarlett Jasper: Finally, Scarlette is our other CBF Missionary we support. She serves in Corbin KY. This is an area of extreme poverty. While still recovering from the flooding in Appalachia, this area has suffered with recent tornadoes, just as St. Louis. Keep this ministry in your prayers as recovery is exceedingly slow as they have so few resources.

The General Assembly coming June 24th, presents an amazing opportunity to meet "our" missionaries as well as many others doing the work of the Lord for many of the world's disenfranchised people. You belong here!
