



A conversation with Alex Hailey, 1965

In January 1965, Alex Hailey interviewed Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., shortly after accepting Nobel Peace prize.

Hailey:

There are several stories dealing with your non-violent campaign to combat segregation. Your followers are called rabble-rousers and outside agitators. Do you feel you've earned these labels?

King responds:

When the early Christians, spread Jesus' doctrine of love, the resident power structure accused them of being "disturbers of the peace" and "outside agitators."

But the small Christian community, **banded together**, and continued to **teach** and **exemplify love**, convinced that they were a "colony of heaven," on this earth who were missioned not to obey man, but God.

You stand on the shoulders of previous generations—continuing to ensure relational and spiritual health—traveling through year 172 of Third's story.

Dr. King's response guides you in a directionally accurate manner—three descriptions of Jesus followers—banded together, teaching, and exemplifying love.

Banded together is forming a group in order to do or achieve something. Third's first band of brothers and sisters in Christ met in an upper room on Market Street—near the Enterprise Center.

And to enhance your spiritual formation and our community with Gospel—all are called to be disciples—**Teach.**

I encourage you to take advantage of various on-ramps, Adult Bible Study on Sundays and Discipleship on Wednesdays (you can review various opportunities in this month's issue). A community's spiritual health is dependent on the education of its people concerning biblical literacy, ethics, history (knowing who we are and where we are from) - and spiritual application.

And all we do is undergirded by **Exemplifying Love.**

First generation Christians brought community transformation through love—not the sword (a lesson soon forgotten). Third continues to embrace diversity while gathering around the Table of Grace—reserving an open seat for *all* seeking faith and connection.

The final words of Dr. King's sermon on Agape Love echo the dysfunction of our *present culture*, and also a word of hope and encouragement to Jesus' followers:

And we ask Thee, O God, in these days of emotional tension, when the problems of the world are gigantic in extent and chaotic in detail, to be with us in our going out and our coming in, in our rising up and in our lying down, in our moments of joy and in our moments of sorrow, until the day when there shall be no sunset and no dawning...

Third will continue engagement with our culture—engulfed with emotional tension—with the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

Dear ones, let us band together, disciple one another, and walk in love.

In Sunday School and Wednesday nights through lent, we'll be listening to the many voices of people Jesus has called to follow him.







Prayer Requests from Keith and Mary Holmes, Missionaries, Cooperative Baptist Fellowship

Dear friends,

We spoke with Petru & Olesea Ciochina, our partners in Moldova. Petru requested prayer for renewed ideas for himself and for their work:

- 1. Sustainable ways to heat the houses and build the church. During the winter months, very few people stay in the small village of Vulcanesti. It is too hard to keep their houses warm.
- 2. Ideas to work with the youth. About ten young people (ages 14-17 and above) have started to come to a weekly Bible study which Petru leads. Even though Romanian is their second language, they seem to be understanding the lessons well. Petru is praying for ways to get them to discuss and participate more freely.
- 3. Pray for those from the church who are working in other countries, to be strong in their faith.
- 4. Find a church where they can come regularly. Very important to be supervised by church.
- 5. Petru to have more vision, more ideas on how to improve the work in the church.

Beginning with the first Sunday in February, discounted tickets of \$20 for <u>Adults</u> and \$10 for Students will be available outside the church office.




