

# From the Pastor

Pieter Brughel:

The Adoration of the Magi in the Snow,

1567

The world is indifferent to the birth of Christ—Joseph and Mary are featured at bottom left, above —background players in the greatest event in human history.

Brughel visualizes birth of Jesus Christ, as it was in reality—with added snow and contemporary setting of Netherlands in 1563.

Jesus' birth was uncelebrated and anonymous as community gathers for census in the city of David. The painting is intentionally "blurry" and "out of focus"—shadows of armed military, parents searching for children, enjoying a cold drink and searching for wood—attempting to find relief from bitter cold.

The surreal setting is assisted by snow, which continues to fall. As hours pass, it seems the painting is destined to fade—covered with snow.

Advent in our post Christian world has certainly placed the birth of Christ on outlines of our culture and completely off the canvas.

The snow blurs reality of blessed event—the Word becoming Flesh in Bethlehem—to take away the sins of the world.

I encourage you to remove the snow from your celebration of Advent. The pundits encouraging you to disengage with friends and family because of an election to misplaced priorities in your own journey.

Focus on the birth of Christ—in all of its overwhelming simplicity—the answer to the problem of sin and death—through the birth of Jesus Christ in Bethlehem.

I trust you are warmed by the love of family and friends—and pay particular attention to those unable to travel home—here with us from India, Puerto Rico, and Africa.

Build a comforting fire for people traveling through their first Christmas separated by death from loved ones.

Third changed the name of our annual community Food Pantry Christmas Baskets event to the Alexandria Hamilton Memorial Christmas Basket Ministry.

Third comes from a long line of faithful witnesses, now cheering us on from afar until we all arrive home.

Let us honor the legacy of servant hearts gone before us—through an invitation to an open seat at your table during Advent.

Never underestimate the power of your table—

The Holy Spirit can guide you as an instrument of love and hope—warmed by fire of your embrace.

Let's all assist one another and help clear away as much snow as possible—in order to see clearly:

Then an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid; for see—I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you this day is born in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord.


